SPECIAL INTEREST GROUPS (SIGS) ARE YOU INTERESTED???

The idea has been floating around for a while. Perhaps now is the time to act.

Recently one of our CMGS members indicated a strong desire to organize an Italian Research Special Interest Group (SIG) for those who are like-minded. This can be done quite easily, especially now that

folks are beginning to come out of isolation. Might you be interested?

Years ago, CMGS hosted a Lithuanian SIG that met every month at the Westminster Public Library. I joined in hoping to find more information on my sole ancestor with Lithuanian roots. For those eight members who faithfully participated, much was learned, and much was shared, friendships were developed, and research buddies were formed. We are all better researchers for being a part of that group and, yes, my participation in that small group helped me to find a few elusive records for my own family. I also learned so much about the history of this country, its people, and the politics that drove its existence. It was a classic example of "more heads are better than one!" and our collective information proved most worthwhile.

So now the word is out. There is interest in forming a CMGS Italian Research SIG. If you are interested, please contact any one of our Board members. A SIG can be formed with as little as three members. Indeed, that's how the Lithuanian SIG began, then grew from there. Depending on where the interested members reside, times and locations can be set up to accommodate all participants. Libraries are our best friends for SIGS, with free use of their small group meeting rooms in quiet locations.

SIGs can be created for just about any genealogical topic of interest. Examples: Family Tree Maker or Roots Tech software users; French-Canadian or Acadian research; DNA; British Isles (Irish, Welch, Scottish &/or English research; Germanic heritage; Emigration/Immigration interests; Timeline techniques; Military research, FamilySearch or Ancestry power users, etc. If you have an idea for a SIG, or interest in forming a small group around a specific topic, please

reach out and let us know. We can act as a clearinghouse to match people with their interests and perhaps set up a SIG or two this year.

The call is now out. It's up to you. Are you interested? If so, speak up. I promise you, you will only gain from participation in a SIG, while your own knowledge will be readily appreciated by your fellow researchers.


